CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

How to Resist the Devil

We underestimate our adversary, the devil, at our peril! Many who used to follow the Lord faithfully, no longer do so, having fallen victims to his snares of lies and deceits (John 8:44). It may seem like an impossible task standing up against him, but he can be resisted. James says, "Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you" (James 4:8). The fact that we have been commanded to resist him should tell us that it can be done. But how?

We must be steadfast. I Cor. 15:58, "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord." Without a mindset to stay the course, falling out is predictable. Like any athlete in a race, we must persist to the finish line (Phil. 3:14), regardless of how challenging it may be at times. Paul said that we should "...consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us" (Rom. 8:18). Too many of us are falling short of our great inheritance that God has in store for us (I Pet. 1:4) because we lack the mindset to stay the course.

We must feed our knowledge with the Word of God. The devil has been successful especially against those who hardly ever study the Bible! Many of God's people in the Old Testament fell into the same trap. God said in Hosea 4:6 "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge." Jesus taught us that resisting the devil will come through knowing the word to empower us in times of temptation. On each occasion as He was tempted by the devil, Jesus resisted his lies and deception by using scripture "It is written..." (Matt. 4:4, 7, 10). The Bible is not a mere literature, it is the sword of the Holy Spirit to fight against sin. Psa. 119:11 "Your word I have hidden in my heart, That I might not sin against You!"

We must be spiritually minded. Our minds will always be somewhere...even in wonderland! In light of the many places our minds can wander, Paul encourages to "set our minds on things above and not on things on the earth" (Col. 3:1) because a mind left on its own will be valuable tool for the devil! The Greek word for "set" means to "exercise or train" implying that we must exercise the mind. According to Heb. 5:14, we can exercise our minds to know the difference between good and evil. So "Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy-meditate on these things" (Phil. 4:8).
