CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

Move Toward Perfection

One could easily sense a level of frustration in the writer of Hebrews as he tries to explain to his readers about Jesus being the High Priest appointed by God. He said the issue had become difficult to explain because his readers, according **Hebrewa 5:11**, had "... become dull of hearing." They were taught the basics of the gospel but seemed to have stuck there in terms of their knowledge. He went on to say in v. 12 "For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the first principles of the oracles of God; and you have come to need milk and not solid food." In **Hebrews 6:2**, he continued by exhorting them

saying, "Therefore, leaving the discussion of the elementary principles of Christ, let us go on to perfection, not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God, of the doctrine of baptisms, of laying on of hands, of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment." Paul also was impeded by the lack of progress on the part of the some of the Corinthian Christians when he wrote in I Corinthians 3:1-2 "And"

Learning the fundamentals of our faith builds a solid foundation on which to grow our knowledge of the Word.

I, brethren, could not speak to you as to spiritual people but as to carnal, as to babes in Christ. I fed you with milk and not with solid food; for until now, you were not able to receive it, and even now you are still not able."

Yes, we must first learn the fundamentals of our faith. Peter says that "as newborn babes, desire the pure milk of the word, that you may grow thereby" (I Peter 2:2). We cannot "go on to perfection" without first learning the basic teachings of the gospel which produce the much-needed foundation on which to learn more difficult lessons in the word of God. It is, therefore, to our own spiritual detriment if we restrict our knowledge to the basic teachings of God's word without progressing further. A lack of spiritual growth in this area will result in ignorance of important decision-making process leading to sin and potentially losing our souls. Paul warned the Corinthian Christians that their carnal (worldly) minds were as a result of them feeding only on milk and not solid food resulting in "… envy, strife, and divisions among you…" (I Corinthians 3:3).

Each of us has a duty to grow beyond the basics as Paul encouraged the young evangelist Timothy who he told to "Meditate on these things; give yourself entirely to them, that your progress may be evident to all" (I Timothy 4:15).
