

CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

Giving is an Act of Worship!

hen a Christian gives his/her offering on the first day of the week, is it an act of worship or just an act that is done based on convenience? It is important to note that worship to God means giving Him the reverence, praise, and love. In doing so, we offer Him our offering! This does not mean that God needs our offering (contribution) since He is not "served by men's hands, as though he needed anything" (Acts 17:25; cf. Psalm 50:10-12; Romans 11:35). However, from a sense of appreciation and obedience, we give our contribution as an expression of thankfulness to Him.

The scriptures are filled with giving of gifts to God as an expression of worship. In the book of **Numbers 18:11**, the offering of sacrifices to God was called gifts. How about the wise who sought the baby Jesus, didn't they offer Him gifts as an expression of worship to Him? (**Matthew 2:11**). When the Philippian saints gave their money for the support of

Giving is an act of worship, not convenience, therefore it must have its foundation in a grateful heart!

Paul, God viewed it as "an odor of a sweet smell, a sacrifice acceptable, well-pleasing to God" (Philippians 4:18). Oftentimes when the New Testament writers mentioned the "fellowship" of the saints, it includes the act of giving (Acts 2:42; Romans 15:26; II Corinthians 9:13).

Since it is an act of worship, it logically follows why God is concerned about the involvement of the heart. We cannot worship God unless our heart is in the right place. To the Samaritan woman at the well, Jesus said, "God is a Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth." "In spirit" refers to the heart. In Matthew 15:8, in reference to the hypocrisy of the Jewish leaders, Jesus says, "These people draw near to Me with their mouth And honor Me with their lips, But their heart is far from Me." Likewise, our giving or contribution must have its foundation in a grateful heart as Paul encouraged the Corinthian Christians "So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver" (II Corinthians 9:7).
