



CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

Phil. 4:13: A Text Out of Context!

There is a good reason why we have been admonished to study God's word carefully (2 Tim. 2:15). A casual reading of the inspired book can lead to spiritual casualty! One of the main rules of interpretation is to interpret a biblical text within its context; anything short of that becomes a pretext for the wrong meaning of the text.

Perhaps more so today than at any other time in history, man has been guilty of taking God's word out of its context resulting in its misapplication. Let's look at one such passage that is among the most quoted by Christians and non-Christians alike, i.e., Philippians 4:13, where Paul says, "*I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me*" (NKJV). This is sometimes described as "*the superman verse*," because it leads one to believe that one can do just about anything as long as Christ gives him the strength. Is that what Paul was conveying to these Christians in Philippi? It is important to note that some verses are better understood when one goes back to the original language and reads it literally. The Young's Literal Translation renders it this way: "*For all things, I have strength in the one strengthening me*." That is the literal reading of the text, but what is the context?


In closing this letter, Paul used the occasion to express his deep gratitude to the Philippian church for their love and concern for his needs (Phil. 4:10-20). Like any traveling evangelist, he had physical and financial needs and this church came to his aid when no other church did. He confessed that there were times when he had very little to survive and at other times, he had abundance. However, whatever the circumstances were, he learned to be content. He was able to endure tough situations because Christ was supplying him with the strength to do so. The issue here is not "doing" but having the strength to endure the worst of times as well as the best of times. Paul says he has learned to be content in all circumstances. This is not about accomplishments, not about climbing every mountain or winning every battle. It's about perseverance through the strength given by God.
