

CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

INVEST IN YOURSELF!

L ave you ever completed a project and then stepped back and admired what a good job **I** you did on it? Perhaps it was a building project like a picnic table, a set of shelves for the stereo, or a birdhouse. Maybe it was a quilt or a gardening project. It could even be the construction of your own house! There's nothing like the feeling of accomplishment and seeing the results of all your hard work. Usually, when we finish a project there's something to show for it at the end, it's tangible, and we can see it, touch it, use it, and even share it with others. When we complete a job or project, we feel proud and self-confident and are ready to take on the next project, maybe even one that is bigger and better than the one just completed. The pride and satisfaction of a job well done is the motivating factor compelling us to move forward to the next challenge and tackle it head-on. Your own personal progress can be seen as you move to more complex and difficult tasks in order to work through the next project. For instance, take the man who began woodworking as a hobby, just building little trinkets in his garage. His interest in working with wood causes him to practice and develop the craft. He studies and practices using the tools needed to complete each project. It's a slow process, but after years of hard work, he becomes a master craftsman, building fine custom furniture pieces that sell for thousands of dollars and are in high demand. He's invested himself in the craft, thus after years of practicing the art of woodworking, he reaps the benefits.

The same principle that led to the man becoming a master craftsman applies to the Christian life and involvement in the Church of Christ. The Christian who invests himself in Christ's service will, just like the master craftsman, reap the benefits in the end. Where are you in *your journey as a Christian?* No matter where you are along that road, there are things to do and learn. Lack of ability, physical limitation, or chronological age is no excuse for not continuing the work set before us. Just as Nehemiah set the people of Israel to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem, you and I must set ourselves to the building of the Kingdom...the church!
