CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

BLACK LITERACY AS IT RELATES TO CHRISTIANITY

ntebellum (the time before the Civil War) southern states had laws that A prohibited enslaved Blacks from reading and writing, or even learning to read and write. In his 1845 autobiography, Frederick Douglass shares his experiences as a slave with an intense desire to learn to read and write. Douglass will later be quoted as saying, "knowledge makes a man unfit to be a slave". Southern Whites and slave owners knew that as long as enslaved Blacks could not read, they were easier to control. When Frederick Douglass finally learned to read, he learned of abolitionists and Jesus tells his followers

the abolition movement. The rest is history.

During this same time period in the north, free Blacks created literary societies where they gathered to read and discuss literature. In fact, the first Black newspaper, Freedom's Journal, was published in New York in 1827 (Bacon, 2007). African Americans knew very well, even then, that literacy was linked to freedom. It is for this cause that many were prohibited from learning or even teaching literacy.

In John 8:31-32, Jesus tells his followers that if they abide in His word, they will know the truth and "the truth shall make you free". Even in scripture we see that literacy is linked to freedom. But what is today's Christian being liberated from? Romans 6:17-22 tells us that Christians were once slaves to sin but "ye have obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered you. Being then made free from sin...". Based on scripture, it was our literacy and our belief that delivered us from sin, just as literacy liberated many Black minds and bodies from bondage in the antebellum south.

If a Christian slacks in reading his Bible, or fails to stay in God's word, he risks not only being a slave to ignorance, but also a slave to sin.
