# **CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH**

# **Artificial Intelligence vs. Divine Intelligence**

L here is much discussion going on presently in the technological and political world regarding artificial intelligence (AI). It is defined as "the capability of a machine to imitate intelligent human behavior" (Merriam-Webster). We must admit the incredible things that AI has been able to accomplish so far, even as it continues to be developed. It is already very much at play in our lives. For example, our smartphones can respond to verbal questions via Siri, Google, Alexa etc. and, according to a New York Times report dated March 7, 2023, "Hungarian physicians are using an artificial intelligence model that can detect breast cancer four years before it develops." This is mind-blowing!

However, as AI continues to develop, it is becoming increasingly important for Christians to think about the relationship between AI and divine intelligence. On the one hand, AI is a powerful tool that can be used for good or evil. It can be used to solve complex problems, improve our lives,

and even help us to understand the universe better. On the other hand, AI also raises some serious ethical concerns. For example, what happens if AI becomes so intelligent that it surpasses human intelligence? What if AI is used to create autonomous weapons that could kill without human intervention? Consequently, there is a bipartisan effort in the Sen-

ate to put legislations in place to properly regulate it.

In light of these challenges, Christians need to remind themselves and the world of who God is! He possesses divine intelligence, He is omnipotent (all-powerful) and omniscient (all-knowing). He blesses man with the intellectual ability to invent technology. However, unlike AI, He never errs (Josh. 21:45). He knows our deepest needs and how to satisfy them (Phil. 4:19). The point is that while AI is able to mirror the intelligence of man, no one nor nothing can imitate God's ability. King David declared, "Therefore You are great, O Lord GOD. For there is none like You, nor is there any God besides You, according to all that we have heard with our ears" (2 Sam. 7:22).

Artificial intelligence must be seen as a gift from the divine intelligence of God. Just as God gave us the gift of intelligence, so has He also given us the gift of AI. AI can be used to help us to better understand the world and to solve some of the problems that we face. However, we must also use AI responsibly and ethically for everything and everyone is subject to God. Paul says, in Rom. 11:36, "For of Him and through Him and to Him are all things, to whom be glory forever. Amen"
