

CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

Avoid The Path of Least Resistance!

In the journey of life, it's common to gravitate toward the path of least resistance. This path often promises comfort, ease, and minimal challenges. However, our spiritual growth and development as Christians is often located in the terrain of resilience, courage, and a firm belief in God's guiding hand.

The path of least resistance can be enticing, as it is devoid of discomfort and hardship. It is the easy route, the downhill slope, the wide gate. It presents fewer struggles, minimal obstacles, and less pain. Yet, as followers of

Christ, we must remember that our Savior Himself did not choose this way. He carried His cross, endured suffering, and gave His life for us (1Pet. 2:21). His journey was not easy, but it was necessary for our salvation.

In the book of Matthew, Jesus tells us, "Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few

find it" (Matthew 7:13-14). This passage clearly emphasizes the importance of avoiding the path of least resistance and embracing the narrow, and sometimes challenging, path that leads to life.

When we choose the path of least resistance, we may avoid discomfort, but we also miss out on growth opportunities that come from facing challenges head-on. Each challenge we encounter is an opportunity to rely on God's strength, rather than our own. They teach us to trust in Him, to lean not on our own understanding, and to submit our plans to Him. Every trial, every obstacle, every hardship presents a unique opportunity to grow closer to God. As we navigate these challenges, we learn to trust Him more deeply, love Him more passionately, and follow Him more closely.

In the Apostle Paul's second letter to the Corinthians, he implores us to "walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7). This means stepping off the path of least resistance and onto the path that God has laid before us, trusting in His guidance even when the way is uncertain or challenging.

So, while the path of least resistance may seem attractive, it rarely leads to true spiritual growth. As followers of Christ, we are called to take up our cross (Matt. 16:24), face our challenges with courage, and trust in God's guiding hand. So let us bravely step off the comfortable path, and venture onto the narrow road, trusting that with God, all things are possible.
