

CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

Forgiving the Unforgettable

Forgiveness. Some speak of forgiveness as if it comes as natural as breathing, while others understand that it often requires a level of spiritual maturity. For there are things in life that a simple "I'm sorry" won't immediately resolve. If someone breaks your favorite coffee mug, you may be more inclined to forgive than if someone breaks your heart or your trust. How do we forgive those who have hurt us so badly? How do we mend relationships that bear the unforgettable?

The Oxford dictionary explains that forgiving entails no longer feeling anger or resentment. The second definition of forgiveness is especially interesting: "to cancel a debt". In Matthew 18: 21-35, we read of a servant indebted to a king. The servant owed the equivalent of \$3.8 billion to the king, but the king was merciful and forgave (canceled) the debt. From this parable we learn that forgiveness involves no longer holding one accountable. When the servant was forgiven, he was no longer held accountable for his debt, the king no longer expected an explanation or repayment upon being forgiven. Likewise, when we forgive someone, we should no longer expect them to answer for their sin, we no longer expect "payment".

If you are not in a place to forgive, continue to pray that God will grant you the strength and the faith to do SO.

When an unforgettable offense occurs, we feel, and even proclaim, that the offense will never be forgiven. True, you will never forget what was done, but as Christians we are to forgive if we expect forgiveness (Matthew 6:14-15). Bringing up repeatedly what the offender did to you is not forgiveness. Expecting endless apologies is not forgiveness. Wishing the offender to always appear "broken...bowed head and lowered eyes" is not forgiveness (Angelou, 1978). When we forgive, the debt is paid, and life continues. The assault no longer needs to be revisited for further explanation, for the debt has been "canceled".

Therefore, one must be honest when he says, "I forgive you". Once you utter those words you eternally liberate the offender, so you must be clear and honest with yourself and the offender. Either you do or you don't; there can be no in between (Matthew 5:37). Wisdom from both parties will decrease the likelihood of a repeat of the offense.

If you are not in a place to forgive, continue to pray that God will grant you the strength and the faith to do so (Luke 17:4-5).
