


WELCOME VISITING FRIENDS

CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

Now That You Have Prayed...

There may be many doctrinal disagreements among professed Christians today, but there is certainly consensus on the importance and necessity of prayer. In fact, it dominates the lives of God's people throughout every dispensation because of the spiritual benefits that one derives from it.

Jesus, knowing that we are prone to getting discouraged especially because of the relentless challenges of this life, says that "...men ought always to pray and not to lose heart;" (Luke 18:1) Paul followed up this same issue and exhorted the Philippian Christians that they should "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God." (Phil. 4:6)

But what happens after we have prayed? Are we not guilty many times of sitting back and waiting to see if God will grant us our "wishes" now that we must make the sacrifice to attend have "rubbed the genie bottle of praver?" For many of God's people, prayer is nothing but a substitute for action. We find it easier to pray than to act. The scriptures' teaching on the efficacy of prayer could not be more different.

If we pray for spiritual growth we Bible study and worship service, and engage in personal study and application of God's Word. It is up to you!

When Nehemiah heard that the walls of Jeru-

salem were still broken down more than half a century after the temple of God was rebuilt, he "sat down and wept, and mourned for many days" and engaged in "fasting and praying before the God of heaven." (Neh. 1:4) Just as Ezra faced opposition in rebuilding the temple of God, so did Nehemiah. Neh. 4:8 says, "They all plotted together to come and fight against Jerusalem and stir up trouble against it." So, what did the servant of God do? "But we prayed to our God and posted a guard day and night to meet this threat." (Neh. 4:9) He did not just pray, he also acted! The Lord then led he and his workers to complete the work of rebuilding the wall. (Neh. 6:15)

If we pray for a job, we must get ourselves qualified, write a résumé, and apply for it. If we have wronged someone, we pray that God will forgive us, but we must go and make it right by apologizing that person in repentance. If we pray for spiritual growth we must make the sacrifice to attend Bible study and worship service, and engage in personal study and application of God's Word.

So, now that you have prayed, what then? It is up to you!
