


WELCOME VISITING FRIENDS

CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

If It Ain't One Thing....! (R. Webster)

srael was facing an impending judgment from God. They were being rejected as God's special people in the old covenant because of their continuous rebellion and ungodliness. However, they needed to understand the dreadfulness of God's punishment on them, so Amos says, "It will be as though a man fled from a lion, and a bear met him! Or as though he went into the house, Leaned his hand on the wall, And a serpent bit him!" (Amos 5:18). Each animal represented a calamity which led from one to the other. There will be no escape for, "when it's not one thing, it's another."

Truly, if ever there was a man who could echo the words "If it ain't one thing it's another," it was Job. Here was one man who knew only too well what it means to be overwhelmed. While there is hardly a good time to get bad news, it does feel like the worst time is when life seems to be going well. His children were having a good time at his eldest son's house when their peace and joy turned into a series of tragedies. One servant came and told Job that his servants who were tending to his flock, had been murdered by robbers and his flock stolen (Job 1:14, 15). Job hardly had time to di-

gest the news when more bad news came. V. 16 says, "While he was still speaking, another also came and said, "The fire of God fell from heaven and burned up the sheep and the servants, and consumed them ... " V 17 says, "While he was still speaking, another also came and said, "The Chaldeans formed three bands, raided the camels and took them away, yes, and killed the servants with the edge of the sword..." Vs. 18-19 say, "While he was still speaking, another also came and said, "Your sons and daughters were eating and

drinking wine in their oldest brother's house and suddenly a great wind came from across the wilderness and struck the four corners of the house, and it fell on the young people, and they are dead ... " Is it any wonder that the Job later acknowledge that "Man that is born of woman is of few days and full of trouble "? (Job 14:1).

Most, if not all of us, can say that there have been times when it seems as if "If it ain't one thing, it's another." There have been times when we just feel like throwing in the towel. The more we learn from the word of God however, is the less surprise we ought to be regarding trials. Peter informed the Christians that this is part of what it means to be a follower of God. He says, "For what credit is it if, when you are beaten for your faults, you take it patiently? But when you do good and suffer, if you take it patiently, this is commendable before God. For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps" (I Pet. 2:20, 21). Jesus said, "In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world" (John 16:33) Paul says, "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us" (Rom. 8:18).
