


WELCOME VISITING FRIENDS

WHAT MUST I DO TO BE SAVED?



CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

The Sum of God's Word is Truth!

One of the most profound questions ever asked in all the Scriptures is "Do you understand" what you are reading?" It was asked of the Eunuch of Ethiopia, by the Evangelist Philip in Acts 8:30, as the Eunuch was traveling in his chariot and reading from Isaiah. Implicit in the question is the fact that one can be reading the Holy Scriptures without understanding it. The Bible, more than any other book, demands of us a proper approach to understanding it. So much misunderstanding, distortion, and false teachings have resulted from a failure to approach it with the right understanding.

Here are a few examples:

In Acts 16:30-31, the Philippian Jailor asked Paul and Silas "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" to which they responded, "Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved, you and your household." Why would Paul and Silas tell him to believe, and he would be saved when Peter and

the rest of the apostles told the Pentecost crowd in Acts 2:38 to "Repent, and let every one of **To understand the sum of what a** you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for gift of the Holy Spirit?" Both incidents seem to be giving different answers which would lead itself. Also, for one to be saved, Jesus says, put them all together. "He who believes and is baptized will be saved, but he who does not believe will be con-

demned" Mk. 16:16. Are we to conclude that belief and baptism only will lead to salvation? Again, we find Peter telling his Jewish brethren about his encounter with the Gentile, Cornelius, and his household, he said "... God has also granted to the Gentiles repentance to life" Acts 11:18. Is this saying that "repentance" only leads to "life" or eternal life? How about Romans 10:10 "For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation." Is Paul saying that only belief and confession will lead to salvation?

What we are seeing here is the use of figures of speech known as synecdoche, where a part is used to represent the whole. To understand the sum of what a person needs to do to be saved, one needs to look at all the passages that teach this subject and put them all together. That is, bring the parts together to make the whole. In doing so we now find the scriptures telling us that for one to be saved, one needs to believe in the Lord Jesus, repent of one's sins, confess Christ as Lord, and be baptized for the forgiveness of one's sins.

We must be diligent in our handling of God's word (2 Tim. 2:15). The psalmist states this quite clearly when he says in Psa. 119:160 "The sum of Thy word is truth ... "
