

CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

Our Compassionate High Priest

In a world filled with hurting, lonely and forgotten people, the writer of Hebrews introduces us to the great High Priest who is both compassionate and understanding. Jesus Christ, our eternal Mediator, bridges the gap between our sinfulness and God's holiness.

The role of the High Priest must be properly understood. In the Old Testament, the High Priest held a sacred position. He interceded for the people and offered sacrifices on their behalf (Lev. 16:14-15). His garments bore the names of the tribes (Heb. 28:29)—a visual reminder that he represented the entire twelve tribes before God. But this earthly office was a mere shadow of the ultimate High Priest to come. Hebrews 4:14-16 introduces Jesus as our compassionate High Priest: "Since then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every

earth experiencing hunger, fatigue, and rejection. He wept at Lazarus's tomb and felt the weight of our brokenness. His compassion isn't theoretical; it's deeply personal. When life overwhelms us, we can approach Him, knowing He understands. His advocacy and mercy also define who He is (1 John 2:1). He does not just sympathize, He advocates. He pleads our case before the Father, reminding The Father of His sacrifice—the ultimate atonement. When guilt weighs us down, Jesus offers mercy, not condemnation. His grace is inexhaustible.

Through Him we have the confidence to approach God's throne of grace (Heb. 4:16). The torn veil in the temple symbolized access to God through Christ. We no longer need an earthly mediator; Jesus is our direct link. We can boldly approach the throne of grace, knowing we won't be turned away.

Finally, in our moments of need—whether in joy or sorrow—we find grace waiting. The book of Hebrews informs us that "...He is able to save to the uttermost those who come to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them" (Heb. 7:25).
