



CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

Do I Really Need to Know Doctrine?

 \mathbf{A} s our society becomes more liberal, an increasing number of religious folks are now questioning whether studying doctrine is truly necessary. Isn't it enough to love Jesus and try to live a good life? While love for Christ is essential, understanding doctrine—the teachings of the Bible—provides a firm foundation for our faith, guiding our lives and guarding us from error.

What Is Doctrine? Doctrine simply means the teachings or principles found in the Scriptures. It encompasses what we believe about God, Jesus Christ, salvation, the church, and eternity. Doctrine answers life's biggest questions, such as: Who is God? What is the purpose of life? How can we be as His children. saved? Without doctrine, our faith risks becoming

shallow and disconnected from the truth of God's Word. Without the doctrine of God, we risk establishing or concocting our own system of righteousness as some of Paul's Jewish brethren had done (Rom. 10:3).

It is critically important to understand that not just any doctrine will do. John specifically mentioned that if anyone "...does not abide in the doctrine of Christ does not have God (2 John 9). In fact, the doctrine must not be treated a trivial matter, instead, Paul told Timothy in 2 Tim. 3:10 "But you have *carefully* followed my doctrine." A casual treatment of the doctrine will result in our spiritual casualty!

Why Does Doctrine Matter? It gives our faith foundation. The Apostle Paul wrote, "Take heed to yourself and to the doctrine. Continue in them, for in doing this you will save both yourself and those who hear you" (1 Timothy 4:16). Doctrine helps to shape how we live. Sound doctrine roots us in the truth, enabling us to stand firm when life's storms come. It helps us to differentiate that which is false in a world full of competing ideologies. We would do well to learn from the Bereans in Acts 17:11, who eagerly examined the Scriptures daily to confirm if what the apostles spoke was truth. We are spiritually equipped and complete when we study and embrace the God-given scriptures. Paul told Timothy that "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work. (2 Tim. 3:16-17).

So then, knowing doctrine is not an academic exercise; it is the lifeblood of a thriving faith. It anchors us in truth, draws us closer to God, and empowers us to live as His children. Yes, you really do need to know doctrine—because it transforms both your understanding and your life.
