CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

Are We Living as Victors or Victims?

Life often brings challenges, disappointments, and struggles that tests our faith and resilience. As Christians, we face a critical question: Will we live as victors in Christ or succumb to being *victims* of circumstances? This question is not merely philosophical—it shapes how we live, respond to trials, and attest to the power of the gospel.

God's word consistently reminds us of our identity in Christ. Romans 8:37 declares, "In all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us," This victory is not based on our own strength or circumstances but on Christ's finished work on the cross. Through Him, we are empowered to overcome sin, fear, and every obstacle life throws our way. A victim mindset, however, traps us in a cycle of defeat, resentment, and self-pity, blinding us to the abundant life God has promised. A victim sees life through the lens of

Being a victor doesn't mean difficulties. This mindset can lead to bitterness, hopelessness, and a sense of helplessness. While we won't face struggles—it it's natural to feel pain and grief in hard times, staying in that place is not God's will for His children. On the other hand, a victor chooses to trust God even in adversity. Victors embrace the truth that God is sovereign and is working all things for good (Romans 8:28). They refuse to let circumstances define them, leaning on God's promises and power instead. This doesn't mean ignoring challenges, but facing them with courage and hope, knowing that Christ's victory over death secures their eternal hope.

So, how can we live as victors rather than victims? First, anchor our faith in Christ, not in our circumstances. Regularly immerse ourselves in God's Word to renew our minds with His truth. Second, adopt an attitude of gratitude, recognizing God's faithfulness in every season. Finally, rely on the Holy Spirit for strength to persevere and forgive.

Being a victor doesn't mean we won't face struggles—it means we face them with God's strength. When we live as victors, we reflect the power of the gospel to a world that is watching us, as Christians. Let us reject the mentality of victimhood and walk boldly in the victory that is ours in Christ Jesus!
