CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

Always Be Ready

1 Peter 3:15 is a cherished verse that inspires us to live Christian lives characterized by hope, constant readiness, and reverence. It states, "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts and always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear."

Peter wrote this letter to Christians facing hardship and persecution (1 Pet. 1:6-7), encouraging them to respond not with fear or Christ. To "sanctify" God in our hearts means to honor Him as holy, allowing Him to be the central influence in our lives. This inner devotion empowers Christians to endure external trials with unwavering hope.

In a world filled with despair, our vengeance, but by centering their lives on hope, which is rooted in Christ's salvation, should shine brightly, especially during suffering.

The word "defense" (or "answer" KJV), comes from the Greek word "apologia," referring to a reasoned explanation or justification. While this word is associated with apologetics (intellectual defense of Christianity), Peter emphasizes a Christ-centered life that naturally prompts others to ask about our hope. As Paul says in 2 Corinthians 3:2-3, "You yourselves are our letter, written on our hearts, known and read by everyone. You are a letter from Christ, the result of our ministry, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God..." In a world filled with despair, our hope, which is rooted in Christ's salvation, should shine brightly, especially during suffering. It's no wonder Christ calls His disciples "the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14-16), urging them to let their good deeds shine before others, leading them to glorify God.

Peter also instructs us to offer this defense "with gentleness and respect." Sharing our faith should be done with humility and reverence, avoiding arrogance or aggression. Paul echoes this in Ephesians 4:15, "speaking the truth in love," and Colossians 4:6, "Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer evervone."

Ultimately, 1 Peter 3:15 reminds us that our lives should visibly reflect our faith, prompting others to inquire about it. By prioritizing Christ and living holy lives, we experience the transforming power of the Gospel.
