

CONTENDING FOR THE FAITH

The Songs of Our Lives

There is no doubt that songs play an important role in our lives. This was even more evident in the culture of those in the middle east. The book of Psalms is filled with Hebrew poems that were originally songs. The song sung by Moses and Miriam at the Red Sea is one such song (Exo. 15). When God gave Israel water in the wilderness, they sang the Song of the Well (Num. 21:17, 18). Moses arranged his final warnings and instructions to Israel into a song, which he taught them (Deut. 32). The Song of Deborah (Judges 5) was sung to celebrate a victory over the Canaanites. The Song of Hannah (I Sam. 2) was the song of a mother's thanksgiving for the birth of her son, Samuel. The Song of Solomon was a song celebrating the love between the Lord and Israel, His bride.

Songs play no less a role today in the church. They take up almost half the time we come for worship. Song leaders generally choose songs that will set the tone or create the right environment for worship. However, here are some important reasons why we sing songs.





your heart to the Lord," and Col. 3:16 "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord."

Secondly, we sing because songs are an expression of our hearts toward God. As we worship Him, the Psalmist encourages us to "Come before His presence with singing and into His courts with praise" (Psa. 100:4). Take for example, the songs entitled "To God Be the Glory," or "O Lord my God." These ascribe the honor, majesty and power that belong only to God. These are facts that we not only learn from the Bible but through observation and experiences (Psa. 19:1). As a result, every success and blessing we experience we should channel the glory and praise to God. Thankfully, being as forgetful as we are, these songs re-position our thoughts on the Lord.

Thirdly, we are to be "speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs..." Eph. 5:19; Col. 3:16. At the forefront of our minds is the reality that each member is going through different life experiences as we fellowship together. Others are discouraged and overwhelmed by issues, still some are overjoyed because of God's blessings in their lives. Consequently, songs like, "Hold to God's Unchanging Hand" or "Heaven Came Down and Glory Filled My Soul" are extremely uplifting and inspirational.

Let's continually sing to the glory of God and to the edification and encouragement of each other.
